



If your child is going to be absent from school/college please call on the numbers below and leave a voicemail before 8am. It is important that you do this so that we can arrange safe staffing levels for every class.





Below is the email I sent with details of the art we submitted which is followed by an email I received informing us we won! We will spend the prize money is class. I am really proud of this work, we all worked together to create it which is one of the main ethos strands of my class. Collaboration, Creativity and Exploration. The piece of art does have the wow factor too. Once it has been displayed in galleries in Brighton we look forward to displaying it by our classroom at college. To Hadia (Virtual Schools)

We have completed our art project!

We were inspired by encouraging collaboration between our learners on the Autistic spectrum. Therefore, we have created a single art piece - it is very large and measures nearly 2m x 2m. We were inspired by the Japanese artist Kiyoshi Yamashita as he also had adityional learning needs. He created art by using torn paper and often used items, paper and material he found. We feel this links to sustainability so we challenged ourselves to create an art piece using only recycled materials. The sky, ocean and sand are all small pieces of recycling from the college. The students were able to tear the materials and sort them into the colour groups. Over a series of weeks we gradually created a night sky, ocean and beach by gluing and layering the torn paper. There is more than 1000 peices of torn paper and material on this art piece! Kiyoshi Yamashita made wonderful scenes with fireworks and we wanted to incorporate this in our art. The fireworks were made by painting the blank side of recycling and then shredding it. The students did well gluing these coming from a circle, as can be seen in the photos. To finish the art we had in incorporate ourselves! So those with a keen eye for detail may spot the students on the beach gazing up at the fireworks. Thank you again for this project and competition. We have been busy making our piece for three months and have all enjoyed working together and focusing on the same thing. It has brought communication and problem solving opportunities as well as the chance to engage in creative and sensory exploration.
