Downs View School Governors' Update

Dear Parents and Carers,

As we approach the end of this Spring Term, the Governors would like to take the opportunity to share a few updates with you and to wish you all the best for the upcoming Easter holidays.

Governor News

As well as our regular Governors' meetings, and our presence at school events and visits, around five times a year we have a Full Governing Board (FGB). The first FGB of 2025 took place on 24 February. The Deputy Head of the Link College gave a presentation on a recent training she had attended on Prevent for post 16 years. Prevent aims to support people susceptible to radicalisation and is embedded into safeguarding practice. After the presentation governors were able to ask questions about how this affects our students.

We also discussed the draft school budget for next year (2025-2026) for which we are awaiting final figures from the Local Authority. This budget is due to be confirmed at our next FGB meeting on 12 May.

Changes to our Governing Body

We were pleased to welcome three new staff governors at the FGB.

- Arnie Strong is the Behaviour Lead at the school.
- Mike Waller works as a teacher at the Link College and
- Joe Parvin is a local doctor

Meet New Governor Joe Parvin

Joe is a local doctor in Brighton, with interests in community general practice, dermatology, mental health and emergency medicine. When he did his medical training, he designed a project and a website to teach Makaton to health professionals, so he has also felt strongly about educating and raising awareness of SEN in the wider community.

He used to work as a supply TA many years ago at Downs View school in Woodingdean and really enjoyed being part of the school community. He could see how much the staff invested in the wellbeing and futures of the learners and so, he is really happy to be back and part of the team once again in some way.

He has become a co-opted governor at Downs View because he feels passionate about extending his community role into education and special needs as he sees many young people and adults with SEN in his own day job. He has decided to become a governor so that he can understand more about how the school functions but also to have more awareness of how education supports our young people in Brighton communities.

Downs View School Governors' Update

Governor Visits

On 13 May Co-chairs Ro St John and Sue Dowling visited Link College for a curriculum visit focusing on the teaching, learning and assessment of English. They met with the Deputy Head Juliet Hudson and English Lead Claire Allen, as well as taking a learning walk during English groups in which all classes were accessing a reading lesson. All pupils were engaged with reading at a highly individual level adapted according to their needs. It was an interesting and productive morning where they noted how supportive staff were in engaging the students in a positive and proactive way using a broad range of strategies which were appropriate for all pupils.

Jacqui Shepherd carried out a safeguarding learning walk on the school site on 12 March with Deputy Head Jackie Hutchings. This involved observing the start to the school day and watching all the children come into class from the minibuses, as well as a brief tour of several classes to observe safeguarding practices. She also attended a meeting with the Deputy Safeguarding Leads for each site to discuss the annual safeguarding audit. This is the detailed document prepared by Jackie Hutchings as safeguarding lead and is constantly reviewed with DSLs with actions noted before final submission to the local authority before Easter. There was robust evidence against all the safeguarding criteria and the governors have great confidence in the school and college's safeguarding processes.



Mike Waller (Teacher of Year 12/13)



My Story

During lockdown I did a bit of running to help with my mental health and over the years have managed to find some consistency. I was working from a low (very unfit and overweight) base and had a long slow journey! Since that tough beginning, of not being able to run for 5mins without giving up to walk and, via a dalliance with some triathlon events and long bike rides, I managed to finish the Manchester marathon last year. I had an injury going into the event so it was a huge struggle to just finish and get across the line. Now I have signed up for the London marathon (April 27th) and want to give it another go, hopefully faring better this year!

Why Sense?

Towards the end of my time at university, I was fortunate enough to be invited along on a trip to Bulgaria. This trip was not a weekend away to discover the nightlife of Sofia(!), but rather a mission of outreach for some of the young people there. At the time of the trip there was a horrid culture in Bulgaria of some people discarding babies who were born with physical or mental disabilities. The charity, we worked with, collected these babies and raised them on the outskirts of Sofia. A significant portion of our trip was set aside to spend time at this orphanage with these disabled children and to deliver some donated clothes and necessities.

The impact of my time spent at the orphanage has stayed with me and I recently have found myself thinking and talking about it a great deal. When thinking about running another marathon and raising money for a charity - Sense was at the top of my list. They are lesser known but do amazing work for deaf and blind people, helping them to access some semblance of normality through various activities and events.

In 2025, lots of charities are doing amazing work for the less fortunate and lots of people are in turn doing some great things with the aim of raising money to support them. My ask is that you give what you can and support me and Sense in this endeavour. I am anxious to run 26.2 miles again as I can still remember the pain and have photos of the blisters! But I feel compelled to do it so that I can make a small difference to the life of a young person.
