

Our Gateway courses are designed for students who benefit from additional support. Gateway provides a calm and relaxed place to learn.

It is a safe place to start your college journey.



We have a range of courses that support with the development of personal and social skills, as well as courses that help you build your independence and skills for when you progress onto other courses in the college, or even the workplace!

Our Courses:

Gateway 1 (Entry L2)

Gateway 2 (Entry L3)

For students who need support with an introduction to college life, travelling and becoming independent.

You will attend college approximately 16 hours a week normally over 3 to 4 days. You will do 70%



English and Maths




English and Maths lessons are included as part of all of the Gateway courses.
